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### Case for Support

The Annual Diocesan Appeal offers Catholics in the Diocese of Youngstown an opportunity to respond to Jesus' teaching throughout the Gospels by ministering to those in need. The Appeal is the primary funding source that allows Catholic Charities to continue *Providing Help* and *Creating Hope* right here in our six-county diocese. In recent years, the number of families and individuals coming to Catholic Charities for help has increased while resources have decreased. This is especially true considering the challenges during the time of the COVID-19 pandemic, when many more have found themselves unemployed or underemployed.

As a result, we are challenged to encourage more people of the diocese to respond generously to the Annual Diocesan Appeal. Only with increased support can we effectively respond to the Gospel call that we serve the least among us in this time and place.

**Catholic Charities** efforts serve the neediest in our communities, regardless of faith tradition. This is accomplished through an administrative unit in downtown Youngstown and three direct-service agencies that minister to individuals and families throughout the diocese. In 2021, Catholic Charities agencies within the Diocese of Youngstown provided direct support to more than 35,000 individuals. **Sixty percent (60%)** of the funds raised in the Appeal are designated for Catholic Charities, which includes:

**Diocesan ministries** impact all parishes and Catholics in our diocese. The support given during the Annual Diocesan Appeal makes evident our discipleship in Christ Jesus through the extension of our ministry to the evangelization and faith formation of individuals and families. **Forty percent (40%)** of the funds from the Appeal are designated for diocesan ministries, which in 2021 supported parishes in their ministry to parishioners through:

- 1,116 baptisms
- 1,125 First Holy Communions
- 1,290 confirmations
- 133 who entered the Church through RCIA
- 254 weddings
- 2,272 funerals

To properly support the efforts of Catholic Charities and these important Diocesan ministries, this year's Annual Diocesan Appeal diocesan goal is **\$4 million**.

## Solicitation and Promotion Methods

The following solicitation and promotion methods will be used for this year's Annual Diocesan Appeal.

### **2021 donor-parishioner letter mailing**

**Week of February 21**

Mailing to all who made a gift to last year's Appeal, including:

- Giving circle members (see **Giving Circles** section)
- Advance gift prospects
- Donor-parishioners giving under \$100 in 2021

### **2021 nondonor letter mailing**

**Week of February 28**

Mailing to Catholics who did not make a gift to last year's Appeal, including:

- Lapsed donor-parishioners, who made a gift 2 or 3 years ago, but have not since then
- Parishioners who have never made a gift

### **In-pew phase**

**Schedule in following sections**

Parishioners are solicited during the Masses on designated weekends. Commitment envelopes are made available and a collection process is established and communicated. Commitment envelopes are traditionally completed by parishioners and collected after the homily on Commitment Weekend. A central collection place using a designated basket or box may be established and communicated with parishioners or parishes may opt to have parishioners place them in the normal offertory collection baskets.

### **Follow-up mailings**

**Weeks of April 25 and May 23**

Mailings are sent by the Office of Development & Stewardship to those who contributed in recent years, but have not yet responded this year.

### **Social media content and videos**

Social media content including videos will be produced and shared on diocesan social media accounts weekly for promotion with their own media outlets.

### **Posters**

Posters are provided for parishes to display in high traffic areas. Spanish posters are available upon request.

### **Bulletin inserts**

Bulletin inserts will be available in PDF and PNG format on the diocesan website ([DOY.org/appeal](http://DOY.org/appeal)).



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### Giving Circles

#### **Mission Makers Circle**

**\$25,000 and above**

The mission of Jesus Christ is to extend the love of God the Father who sent Jesus to earth so that we could come to know him and have eternal life. Mission Makers believe in the mission of Jesus Christ such that they make the Annual Diocesan Appeal a priority in their charitable giving with gifts of \$25,000 or more.

#### **Circle of Hope**

**\$10,000-\$24,999**

As a Christian virtue, hope allows one to believe that the world can be made a better place by serving others in the way of Jesus Christ. Members of the Circle of Hope are inspired by the teachings of Jesus and seek to spread his hope with gifts to the Annual Diocesan Appeal between \$10,000 and \$24,999.

#### **Circle of Discipleship**

**\$5,000 to \$9,999**

The disciples were personal followers of Jesus when he was on earth, following him where many others would not. Members of the Circle of Discipleship emulate the same fervor Jesus' own disciples had for his ministry, and make gifts of \$5,000 to \$9,999 to the Annual Diocesan Appeal.

#### **Circle of Charity**

**\$2,500 to \$4,999**

Acts of charity are an extension of our goodwill and belief that it is our duty to share with others what God has given to us. Members of the Circle of Charity recognize their gifts and share them back with the Lord and his people with gifts to the Annual Diocesan Appeal between \$2,500 and \$4,999.

#### **Circle of Compassion**

**\$1,000 to \$2,499**

Jesus Christ had profound compassion for the needy and those on the peripheries. Members of the Circle of Compassion seek to be Christ-like in their compassion for those with physical and spiritual needs with gifts between \$1,000 and \$2,499 to the Annual Diocesan Appeal.

#### **Sustainers Circle**

**Recurring gifts in any amount**

Sustainers provide the most consistent support of the Annual Diocesan Appeal through automatic recurring weekly, monthly, or quarterly gifts of their desired amount. More information is available on the diocesan website, DOY.org.

## Methods to Make a Gift

The following methods to make a gift will be used for this year's Annual Diocesan Appeal.

### **Respond to a direct mail solicitation**

All direct mail solicitations include a response envelope for donor-parishioners to mail directly to the Annual Diocesan Appeal post office box.

### **Respond to the in-pew phase**

Parishes are provided in-pew response envelopes that donor-parishioners can mail directly to Annual Diocesan Appeal post office box or placed in designated collection area(s) at parishes, including offertory collection baskets.

Any gifts returned to the parish should be sent to the Office of Development & Stewardship at the designated times (See **Reporting Results**).

### **Make a gift online**

Donor-parishioners can visit the diocesan website ([DOY.org/appeal](http://DOY.org/appeal)) to find the Annual Diocesan Appeal webpage with a link to make a gift online. The online giving service provider for the Annual Diocesan Appeal is GiveCentral, a reputable service provider among Catholic dioceses across the United States.

### **Make a stock gift or IRA distribution**

## Gift Frequency Options

Donor-parishioners can make a gift in any of the following frequencies:

### **Sustaining gift** (online recurring only)

Online recurring gifts can be set up for weekly, monthly, or quarterly installments. Donor-parishioners have the option to make an ongoing gift (without a specified end date) or to set a final installment date for their gift.

### **Monthly installments** (direct mail or online)

Giving statements are sent monthly by the Office of Development & Stewardship to donor-parishioners who choose to make a gift in monthly installments.

This total may be offset with a one-time gift at the beginning of the Appeal process.

### **Quarterly installments** (direct mail or online)

Giving statements are sent quarterly by the Office of Development & Stewardship to donor-parishioners who choose to make a gift in quarterly installments.

This total may be offset with a one-time gift at the beginning of the Appeal process.

### **One-time gift** (direct mail or online)

Donor-parishioners may make a one-time gift at any time of the year, but it is encouraged during the active solicitation process (the seasons of Lent and Easter) to not necessitate sending addition direct mail solicitations.

## Suggested Homily Points for Announcement Weekend

We encourage you to use this introductory paragraph so that everyone in the diocese will have a similar understanding of the movement from the former Annual Bishop's Appeal to the Annual Diocesan Appeal.

"This weekend, we are uniting with parishes throughout the diocese in announcing the 2022 Annual Diocesan Appeal. Replacing the former Annual Bishop's Appeal, this annual campaign will continue to make possible the necessary funds to first and foremost allow Catholic Charities within our diocese to assist in caring for our brothers and sisters suffering from physical, emotional and spiritual poverty. It will also continue to provide for a vast array of diocesan ministries reaching into every parish, school, and institution across our six counties, from priestly and lay ministry formation, to marriage and family ministry, to religious education and Hispanic ministry, and much more. The new focus of the Annual Diocesan Appeal invites us to reflect upon and take to heart the theme: *One in Hope, One in Mission*. The prayers and readings for this announcement weekend could not be better designed as we unite in this great effort."

Below are other points you are encouraged to use in your homily.

- In the opening prayer (collect) for the Mass today, we prayed: "That the course of our world may be directed by your peaceful rule and that your Church may rejoice, untroubled in her **devotion**."
- That sense of devotion is echoed in the second reading, as we hear, "Therefore, my beloved brothers and sisters, be firm, steadfast, always fully **devoted** to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."
- Whether starting as a Catholic Charities Appeal, or later, as the Annual Bishop's Appeal, and now, as the Annual Diocesan Appeal, the greatest common factor has been the devotion of the people of God throughout our diocese, joining together, and offering their resources to bring greater hope into the lives of those in need, and to set our Church firm in a renewed sense of mission.
- A steadfast dimension of the various appeals over time, is the great majority of funds that goes directly to the work of serving the poor and needy among us through the work of Catholic Charities. Something everyone should be aware of and very happy to know.
- Indeed, the words of the Gospel today invite us all to glorify God for an abundance of blessing in our own lives, and then make the appropriate response to the appeal, for, "A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good."
- Many of you who have so lovingly and generously responded to the past appeals have already received information about the new Annual Diocesan Appeal in the mail. If you have not, in the pews (or bulletins) today, we have the Appeal brochure, including the response portion. We ask that you take some time to read over the various ways in which the funds generated by the Annual Diocesan Appeal will have an impact on reducing poverty and increasing ministries in our six counties.
- In a very real way, our response to the appeal is a response of thanksgiving to God. As we sang in our response today, "Lord, it is good to give thanks to you." Uniting with the many throughout our diocesan Church, may we strive to be one in hope and one in missions, that all may be one.

## Roles of Key Parish Personnel

### **Role of the Pastor/Administrator/Parish Leader/Pastoral Associate**

- Serve as parish's leader for the Annual Diocesan Appeal.
- Involve pastoral council, finance council, commissions, and organizations in working toward the successful attainment of the parish goal.
- Encourage participation of every registered parishioner through the procedures recommended in this manual.
- Oversee the Appeal effort at the parish ensuring adherence to the Appeal timeline.
- Assist the Director of Development & Stewardship in evaluating the Appeal effort.

### **Role of the Witness Presenter** (optional but encouraged)

- The pastor may select a lay parishioner to give a short witness talk about why they traditionally make a gift to the Appeal.
- This should occur on Commitment Weekend(s) 2 and/or 3 during normal announcement time.

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### Guidelines for In-Pew Phase

#### **Announcement Weekend**

**8<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**February 26/27**

1. Presider gives homily with provided points.
2. Presider announces the Appeal from the pulpit at all Masses during normal announcement time (see **Suggested Pulpit Announcements** section).

#### **Commitment Weekend 1**

**1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Lent**

**March 5/6**

1. Designated announcement appears in the bulletin.
2. Letter from the pastor encouraging support of the Appeal appears in the parish bulletin.
3. Volunteers designated by the Pastor ensure commitment envelopes are in place before each Mass and a collection location is clearly established and communicated.
4. Presider gives homily including how sacrificial giving to the Appeal is a form of almsgiving.
5. At the end of the homily, the manner in which the commitment envelopes are made available and collected is noted, in keeping with the custom the parish has established.
6. During announcement time, a short announcement is made referencing the homily and availability of commitment envelopes.

#### **Commitment Weekends 2 and 3**

**2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays of Lent**

**March 12/13 and 19/20**

1. Designated announcement appears in the bulletin.
2. Volunteers designated by the Pastor ensure commitment envelopes are in place before each Mass and a collection location is clearly established and communicated.
3. During the homily, parishioners are asked to fill out a commitment envelope if they did not do so previously, either in church or through the mailing from Bishop Bonnar. Parishioners are reminded that if they do not respond at this time they will be contacted in the near future.
4. A lay parishioner may give a short witness talk after Communion about why they support the Appeal.
5. During announcement time, an update of parish progress is given.

#### **Follow-up Weekends 1-4**

**4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent-Easter Sunday**

**March 26/27-April 16/17**

1. Designated announcement appears in the bulletin.
2. Volunteers designated by the Pastor ensure commitment envelopes are in place before each Mass and a collection location is clearly established.
3. During announcement time, an update of parish progress is given.
